



Throughout the season of Advent, Mary plays a central role in the Scripture readings and celebrations that lead to emembering the birth of Christ

Christmas Day. This weekend we celebrated the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and next Wednesday the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe which commemorates the apparition of Mary to a Mexican peasant, Juan Diego, in 1531 on December 12. In place of the flowers he presented to her, she left her own image resembling the woman described in the Book of Revelation as well as transmitting some Mexican symbolism. Please check the bulletin for the times the Mexican community will be celebrating the Feast Day here.

Both titles of the blessed Mother have particular significance for us. Mary, the Immaculate Conception, is Patroness of the United States and under the title Our Lady of Guadalupe, she is Patroness of the Americas. As we continue our journey towards Christmas, let us ask her intercession. Nearing our celebration of the day she brought Christ into the world, by her prayers may the world move closer to Christ.
