

Due to the Thanksgiving Holiday our bulletin needed to be submitted early for publication without donation details.



In 1992 I was stationed at Blessed Virgin Mary Help of Christians Parish in Woodside, Queens. It was that year that I received the unusual request to play the role of the King of Siam in the parish production of Rodgers and Hammerstein's, The King and I. Although God did not choose to gift me with a great singing voice, in this role it was not really necessary. In any case, there was one scene where Anna questions why the King made a certain decision, his response was simply, "I am king," indicating that, as such, all authority was his. This would certainly have been the attitude of kings in the time of Christ. They might take the time to consult with their advisors but, ultimately, decision making power was theirs and those around them would simply do as ordered.

Today, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. Yet, He exercises His kingship in a very different way. By His life, we receive an example of love always in action. Instead of telling us what we must do, our King shows us who we can be and invites us to follow His lead. Christ is Our King, but He is a King Who loves His subjects. As his loyal nation, may we love Him in return and express that love in action.


Bus will pick everyone up at 7:45

A.M. and the first stop will be twelve noon family style lunch at Good and Plenty Restaurant. We will then go to Sight and Sound Theatre for the three o'clock performance of "Jesus". The return trip will begin at 5:45 P.M. we should arrive back at approximately 9:30 P.M. Deacon Art will have his car if anyone needs a ride home from the Church.

The bus will not be stopping on the way down so you might want to bring a light breakfast with you on the bus. Bus drivers have new contract rules and they may not be able to stop on the way home. You might want to pick up something for dinner at Good And Plenty or during the intermission at Sight and Sound. Bus drivers are only allowed a certain number of hours driving on the trip and this determines whether we have a short stop or not on the way home. Please consider bringing home a light dinner with you or the bus.

Dear Parishioners of Transfiguration/St. Stanislaus Kostka,

We are delighted to invite you to see and purchase handmade religious articles made by the Sisters of St. Elisabeth Convent (Belarus).

The exposition will take place on November 30, 2018 (Friday) after the 8:30am Mass at St. Stans and 12 Noon Mass at Transfiguration.

The Sisterhood of Saint Elisabeth was founded in 1996. For more than 20 years our sisters have been rendering spiritual, social and financial support to the sick and the suffering at the National Psychiatric Clinic, the boarding home for children with special needs and mentally challenged adults, a TB clinic.

In recent years a rehabilitation center for the homeless, drug and alcohol addicts, ex-prisoners was established 20 miles away from the Convent. Over 180 residents live here today. Many lost and struggling people get a chance to tackle their problems and start a new life with God.

A rehabilitation facility for females was established in 2012. Women released from jail, the homeless and mentally challenged women stay there. Today there are 30 women and one toddler at this farmstead.

To help these people workshops were established on the grounds of the Convent. Many of these sick people have a possibility to express themselves in art for God working together with sisters and making beautiful articles (hand painted icons, crosses, crucifixes, woodcarvings, embroidered and ceramic gifts, vest-

All these goods are made with love and prayer and bring blessing to your home. You will support many people in need by purchasing items of devotions for yourselves and your beloved ones.


